

Information Regarding COVID-19

What is COVID-19?

It is a viral type of cold. **It is characterized by fever, sore throat, extended coughing periods (about a week), and strong fatigue.** The incubation period between infection and the onset of symptoms is said to be from 1 to 12.5 days (most cases being 5 or 6 days).

COVID-19 is said to be transmitted by droplet contagion and contact contagion.

Droplet contagion	Viruses are expelled together with droplets (sneezing, cough, saliva) from an infected person and others breathe them in and become infected.
Contact contagion	After covering a sneeze or cough with their hand, an infected person touches their surrounding objects, placing virus on them. Infection happens when others touch these objects, the virus gets on their hands, and they then touch their mucus membranes (mouth, nose, eyes, etc.).

If the infection worsens, it can lead to pneumonia. Deaths have been confirmed, so please take precautions. Older people and people with underlying conditions are said to be particularly susceptible to severe cases.

What can you do in your daily life?

Firstly, washing your hands is important. Make sure to frequently wash your hands with soap and use disinfectant fluid when returning home from outside, as well as before and after cooking and eating.

For people with symptoms like coughing, covering a cough or sneeze with your hand could lead to the infection of others via objects such as doorknobs, so please make sure you follow coughing etiquette.

People with existing conditions and of older age should avoid crowded places as much as possible and take extra care to avoid infection.

If you have fever or other cold symptoms, do not go to school or work.

If you have fever or any cold symptoms, measure and record your body temperature daily.

Who should get examined for COVID-19?

People with the following symptoms should contact a "Consultation Center for Returnees and people who have had contact with COVID-19."

Cold symptoms and a fever higher than 37.5 degrees Celsius which has continued for 4 days or longer. (Includes situations in which taking fever medication is necessary.)

Strong fatigue and shortness of breath.

***For people of older age and those with underlying conditions, they should inquire regarding COVID-19 if the symptoms continue for 2 days.**

The center will ask you about your symptoms and if necessary will refer you to a medical institution with an outpatient department specialized in possible COVID-19 cases.
