

I need a certificate of criminal record for Japan, where can I apply for one? What do I need for the application?

You can apply for a criminal record certificate for free at the Identification Division of the Prefectural Police Main Headquarters or Regional Police Headquarters which has jurisdiction over your registered address. Reception hours are Monday to Friday from 8:45 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.



The documents needed to apply are as follows:

- A valid passport
- Personal Identification (one of the following): Residence Card, Driver's License, Certificate of Residence (within 6 months from issue), etc.
- Official document(s) proving the necessity for the certificate (issued by the public institution to which it is submitted)



Based on the information from the Hokkaido Police website

Points to make note of

- Fingerprints will be taken at the time of application, so the applicant must go in person to the police headquarters to complete the procedure. Applications by proxy are not accepted.
- Depending on the country to which the certificate will be submitted, immediate issuance may not be possible. It may be necessary to go through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, so be sure to call the police headquarters in advance to confirm this.
- Reservations are not required, however, if you wish to have an interpreter, you must inform the police headquarters in advance of the date and time you plan to visit them.
- The certificate will be issued approximately 10 days after application, so make sure to apply well in advance.
- The certificate can be received in person or by an authorized representative. Please note that the certificate cannot be sent by post.
- Depending on the country to which the certificate will be submitted, official seal authentication and apostille by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs may be required. For more information, please check the Ministry of Foreign Affairs website.
- If you live abroad, you can apply at your local Japanese embassy or consulate. It takes approximately three months from application to issuance.
